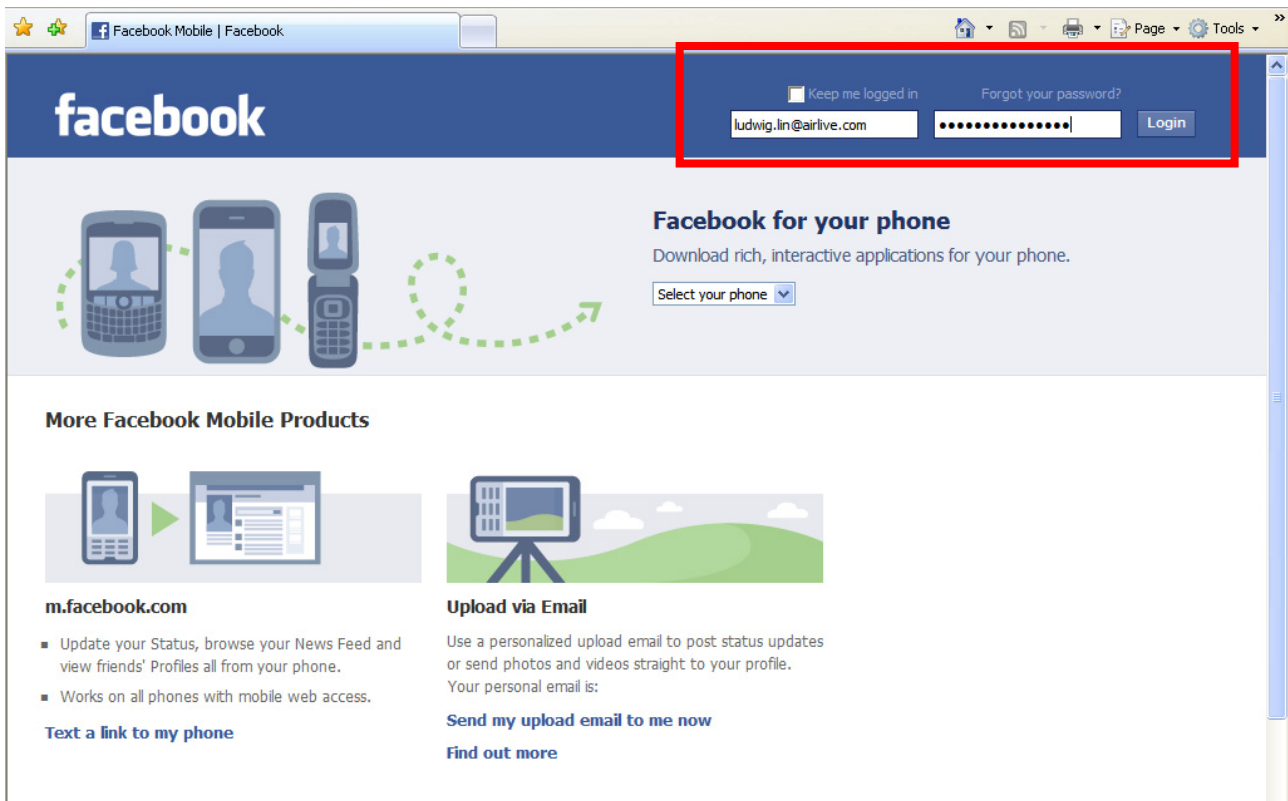
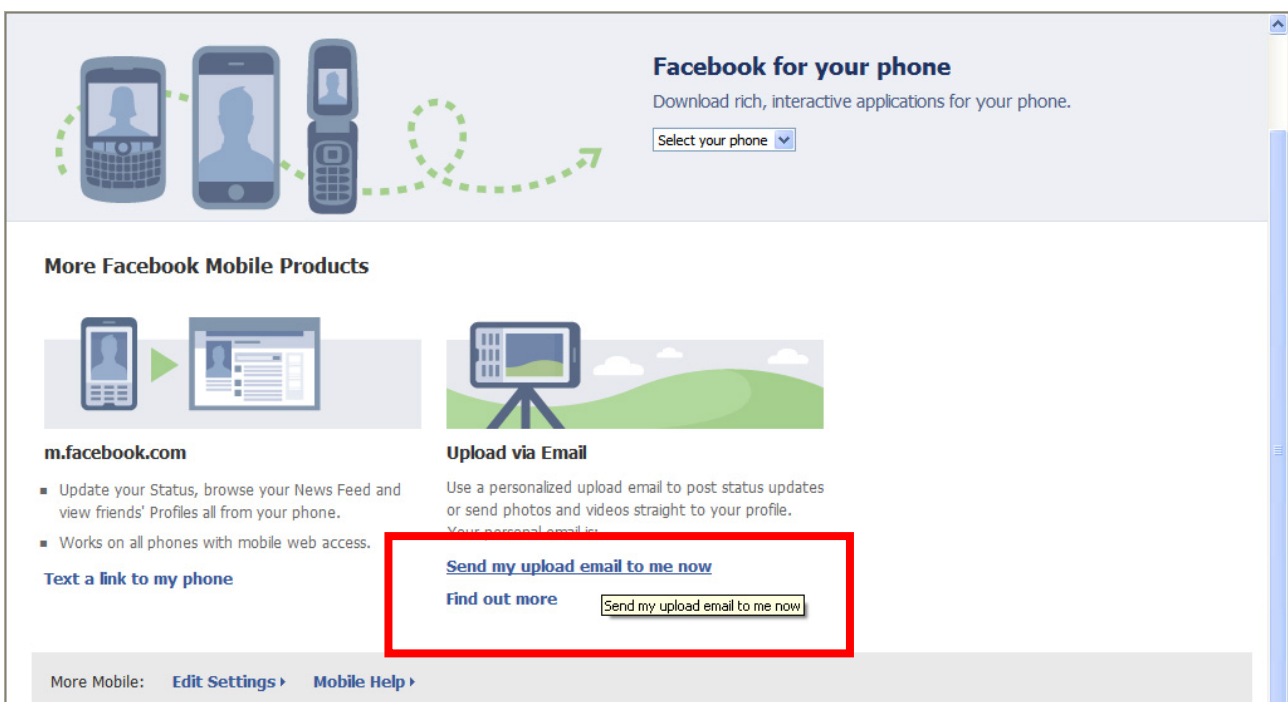


Using AirLive IPCAM with Facebook Album

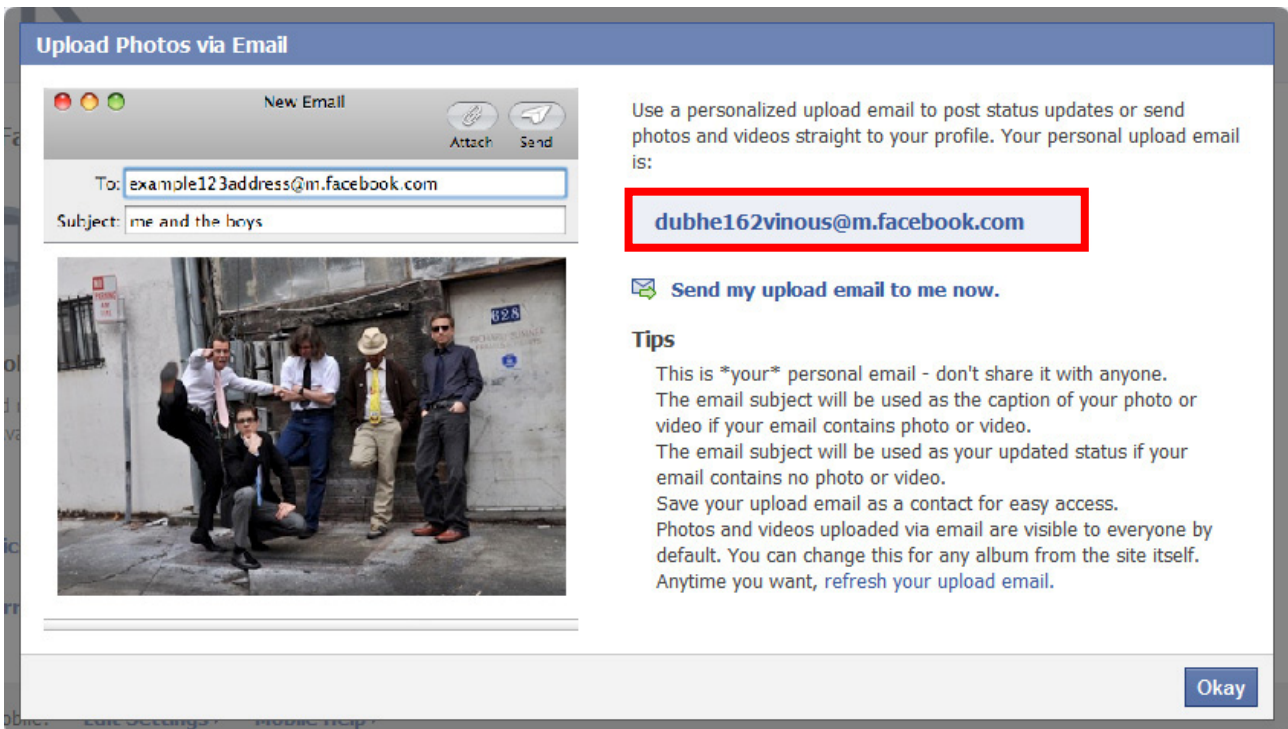
1. Link to the URL <http://www.facebook.com/mobile>, and login with your facebook account



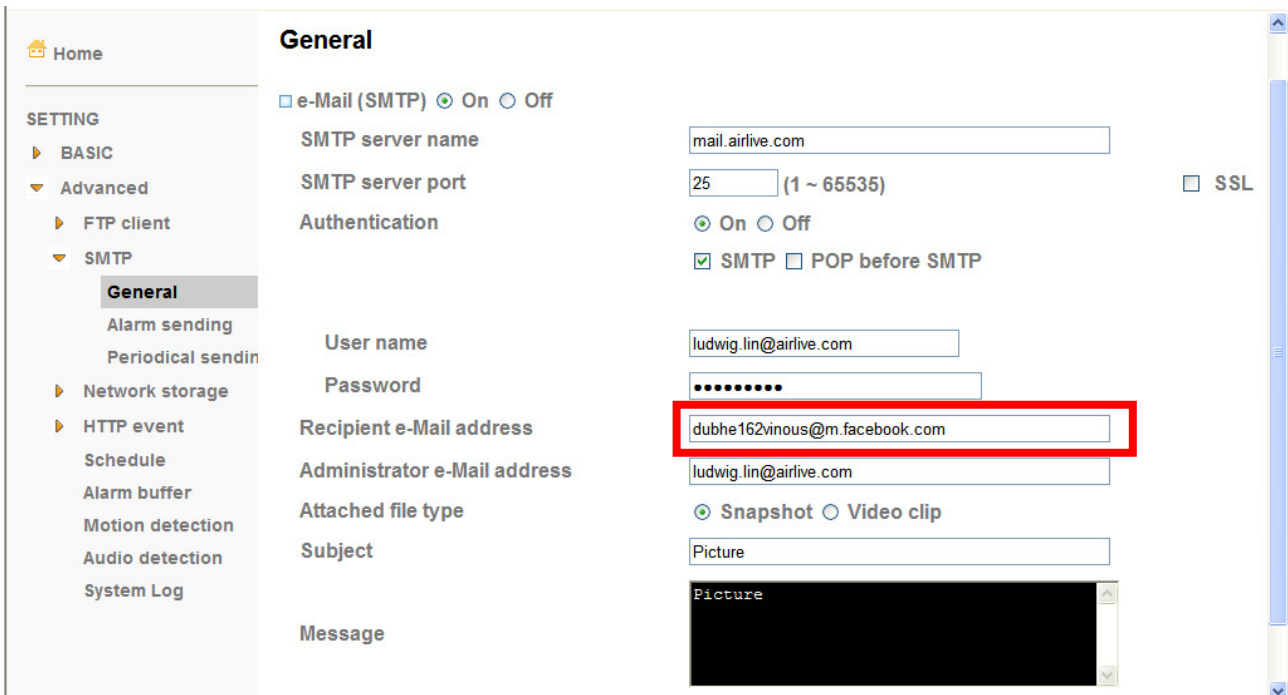
2. Require your uploading mail address by clicking the “Send my upload email to me now”.



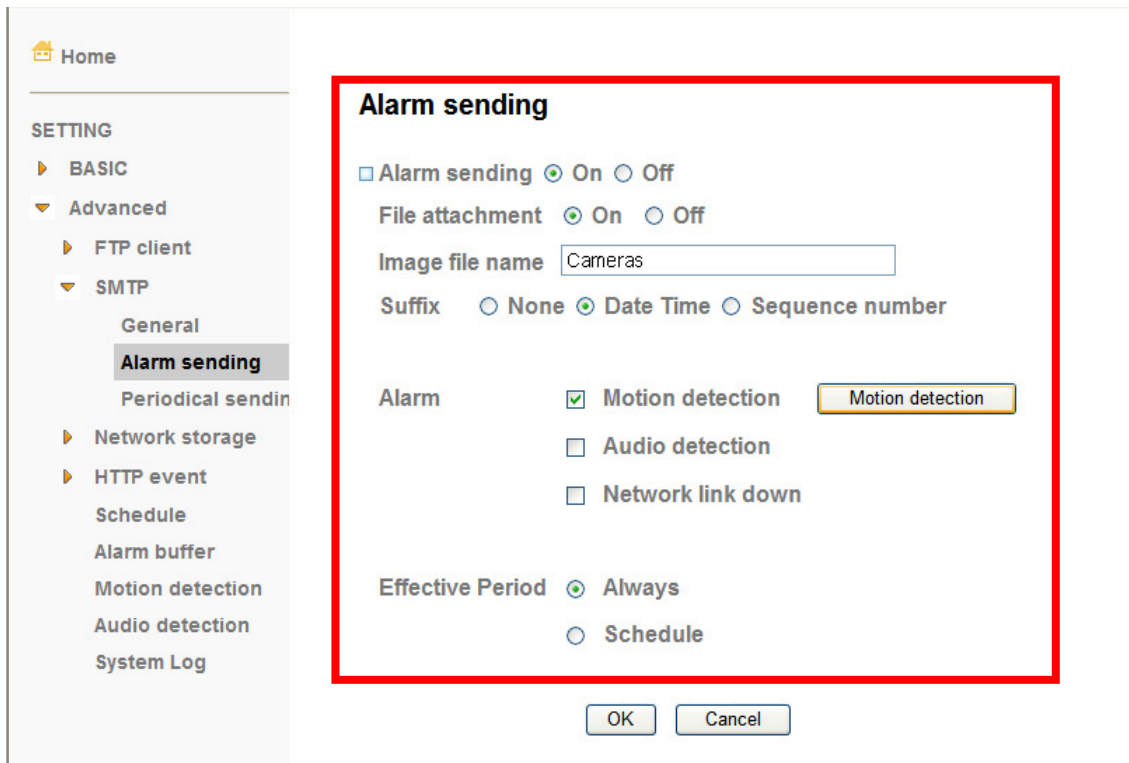
3. Write down the specific mail address on the "Upload Photos via Email" popup window.



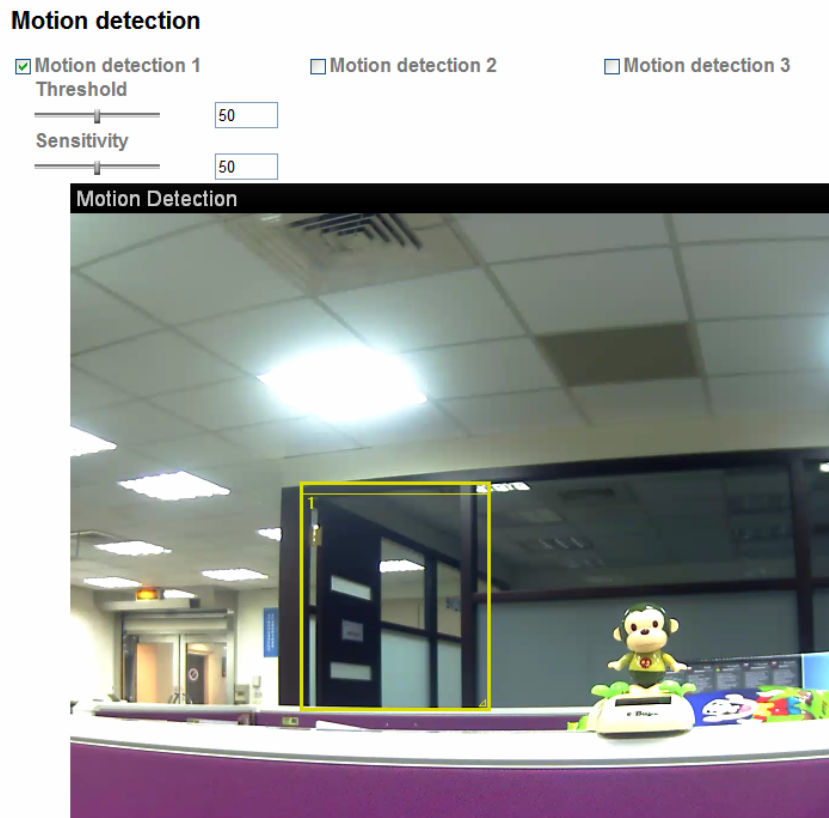
4. Open the e-mail setting page of AirLive IPCAM (SMTP→General) and fill out the information for sending alert e-mail. The recipient's e-mail address should be the one you got in step 4.



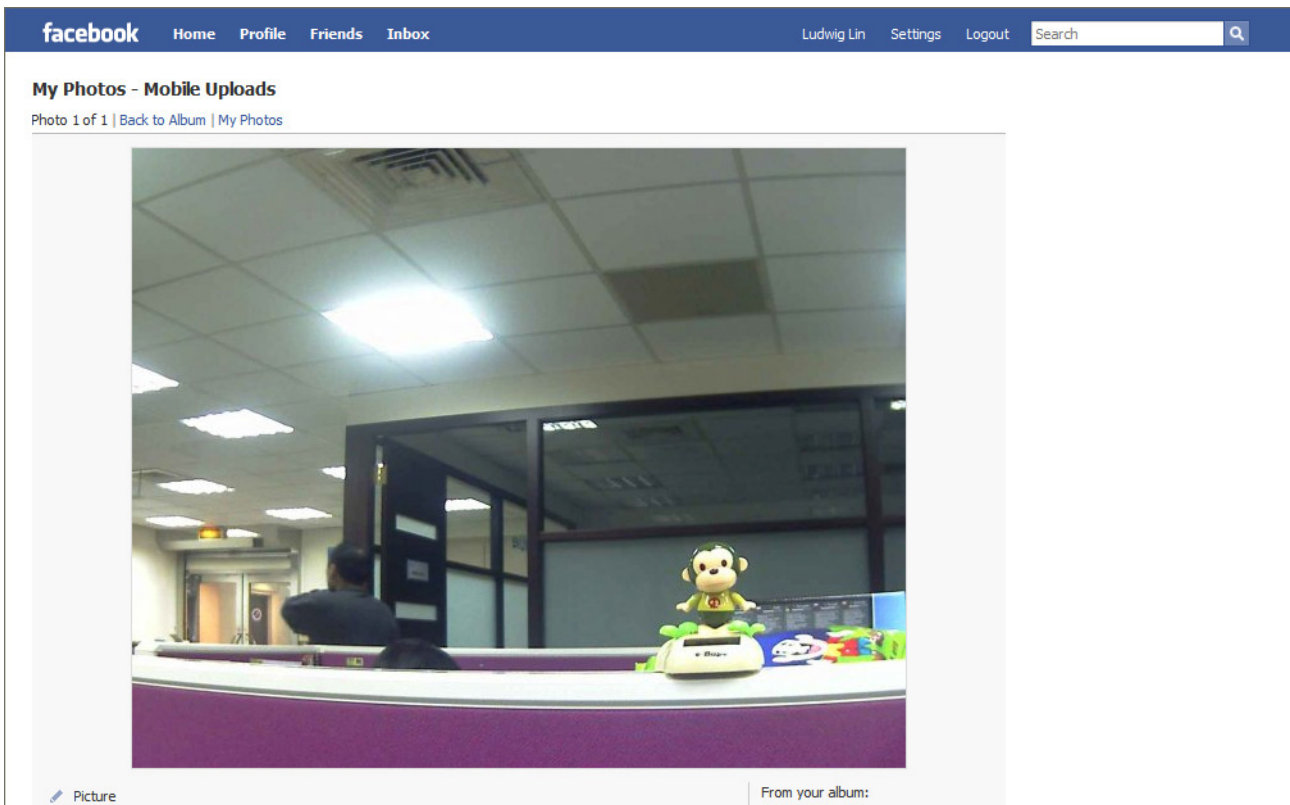
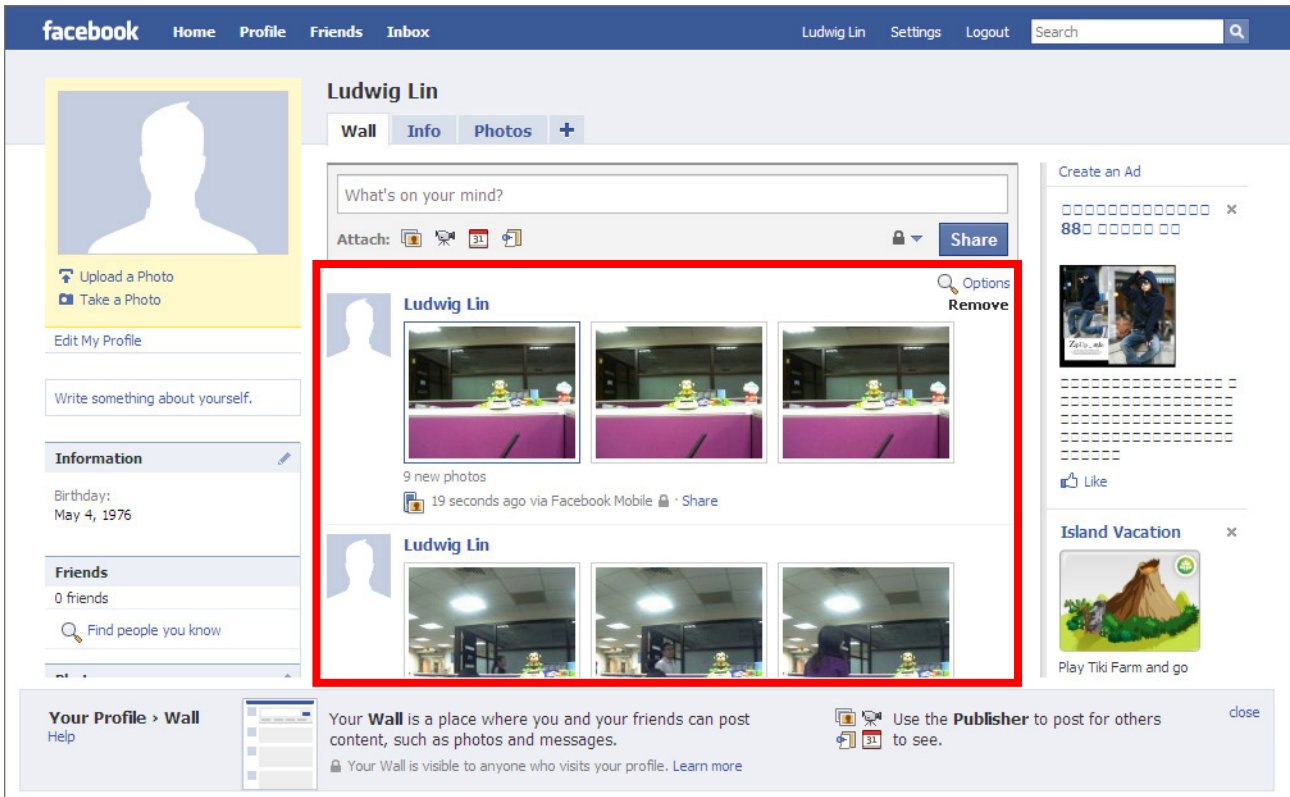
5. Open the Alarm Sending page (SMTP→Alarm Sending) for further configuration.



6. Click on the Motion Detection button for setting the Motion Detection area and its relative parameter.

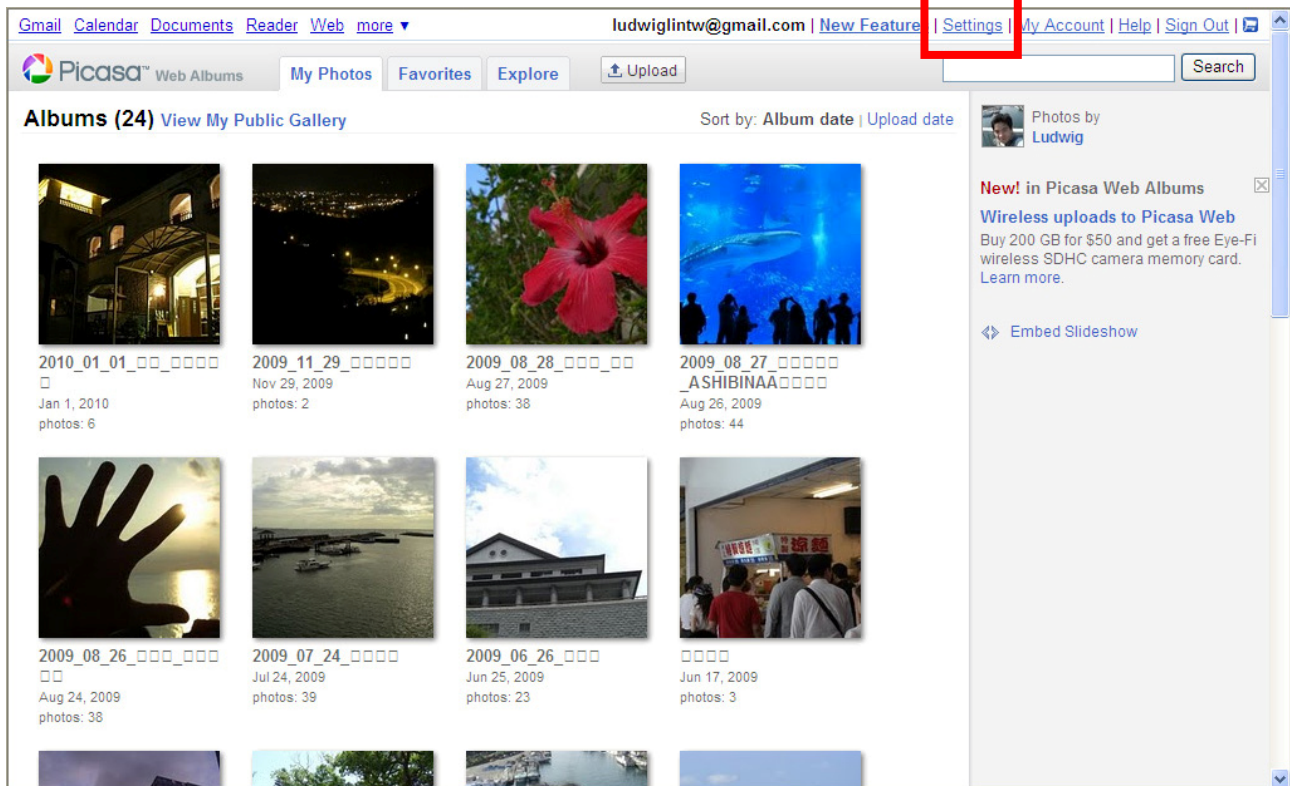


7. After the configuration steps above, whenever the Motion Detection event happens, AirLive IPCAM will upload the alert image to your Facebook album.

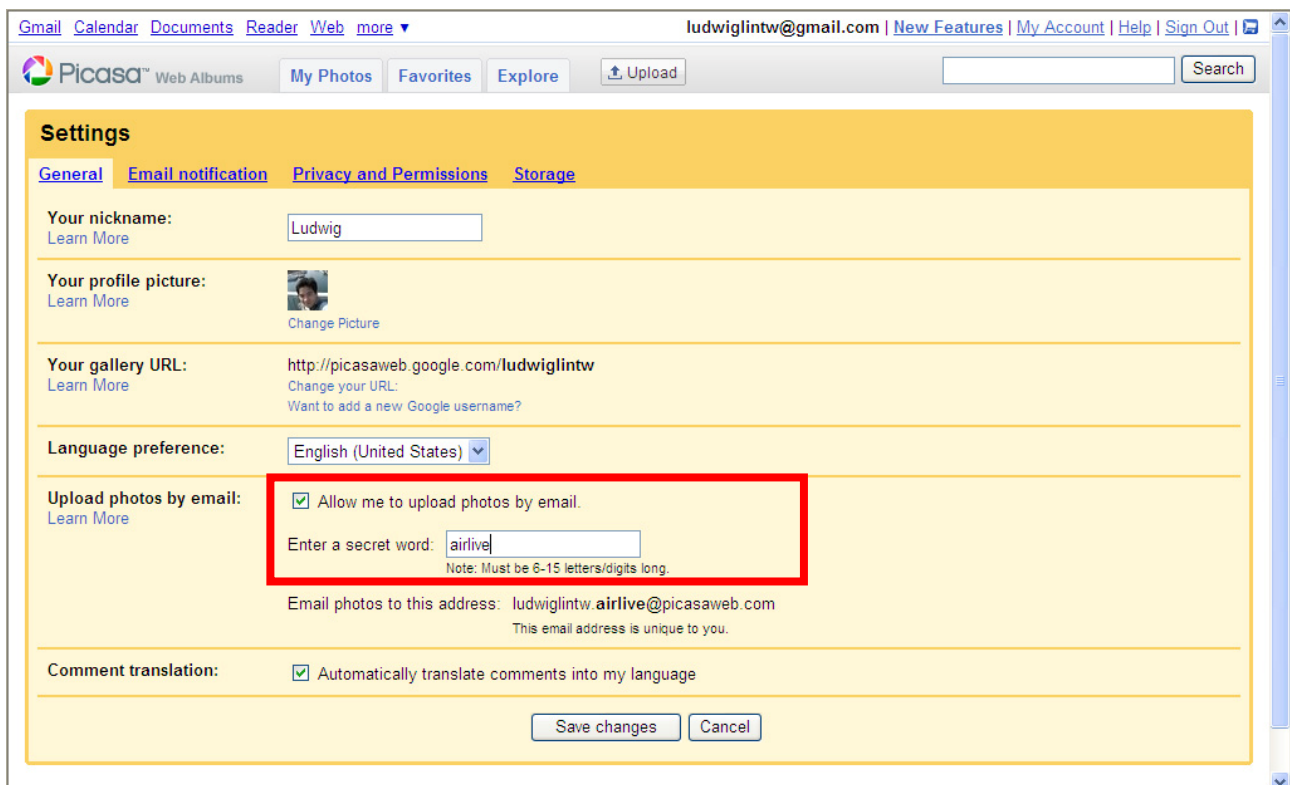


Using AirLive IPCAM with Picasa Album


1. Login to the Picasa and click on the “Settings” on the right-up of the page.



2. Check the option “Allow me to upload photos by email”, and then enter the secret word for getting the upload email address.




3. Write down the specific email address.



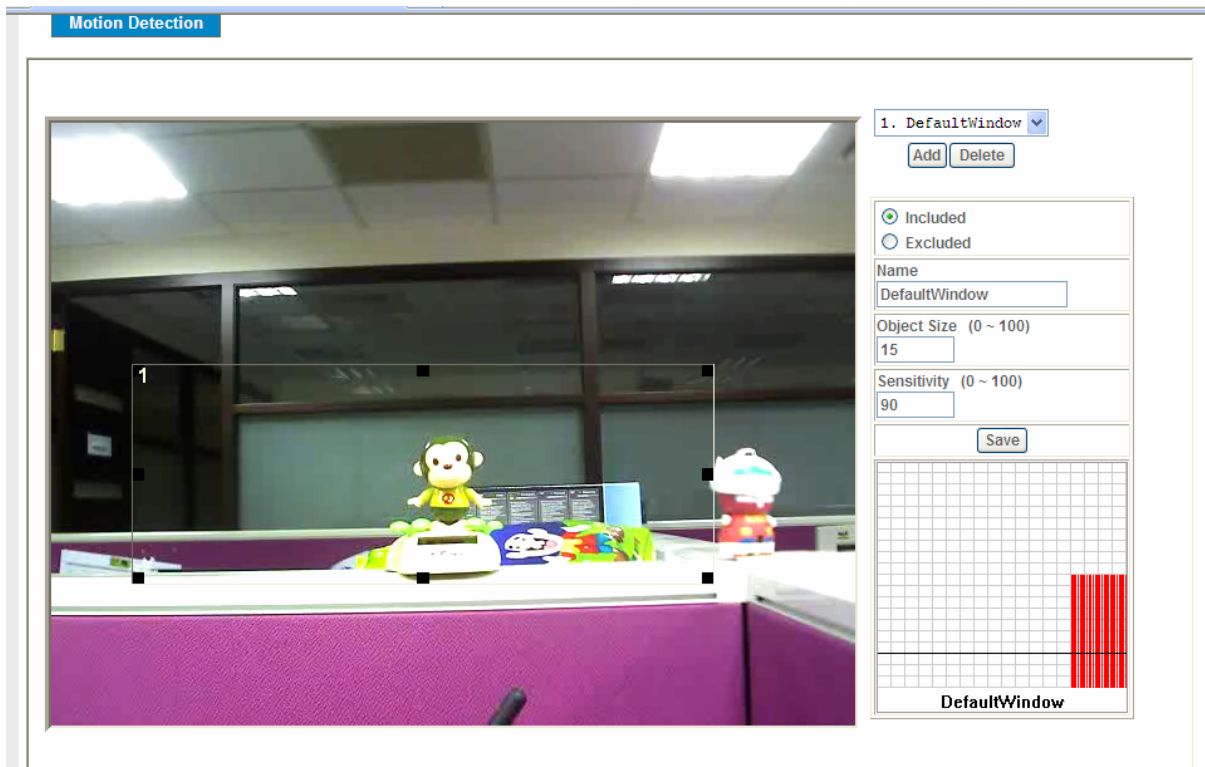

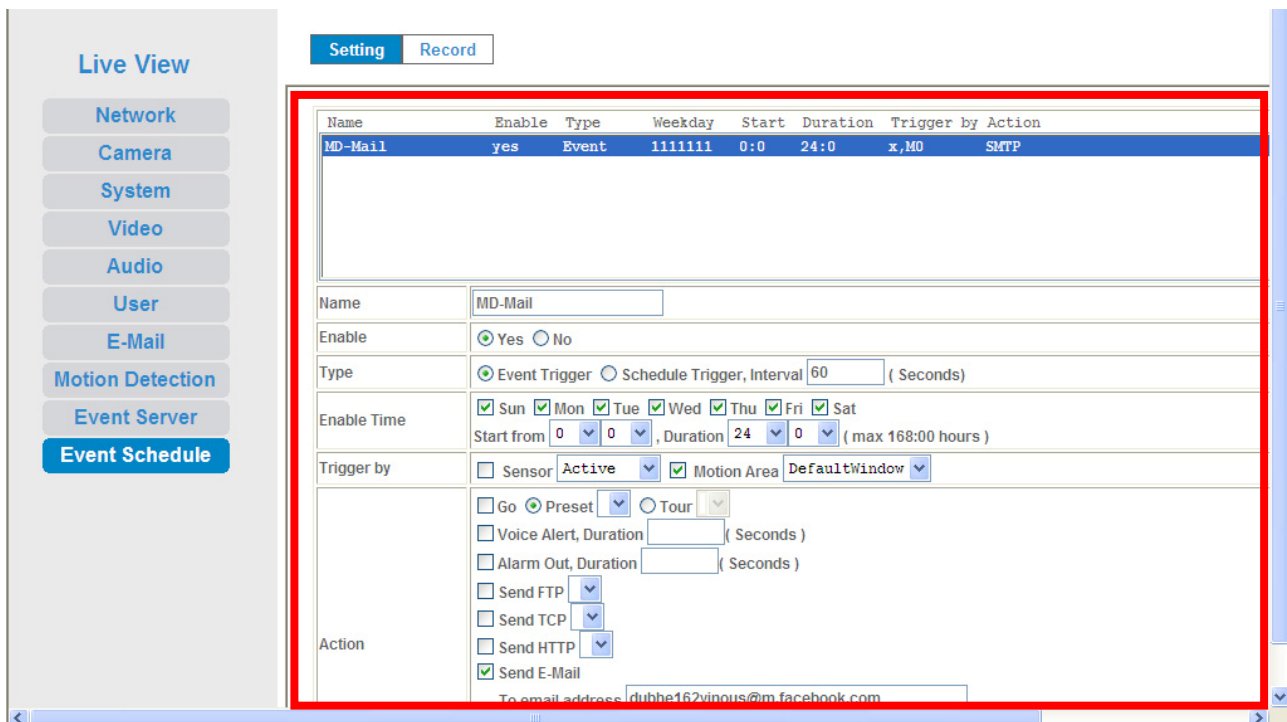

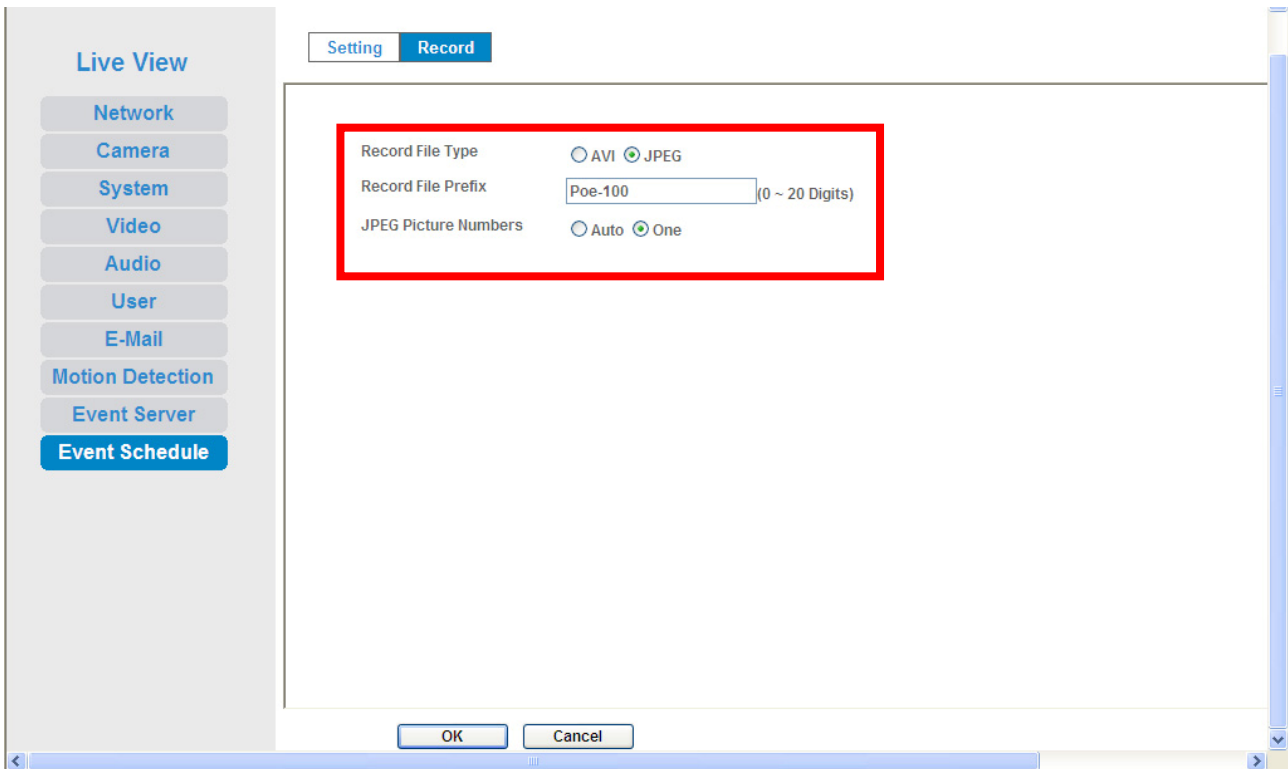
- Open the Motion Detection configuration page and set the motion detection area.
